# WalkBike Springfield April 14, 2022 Meeting Notes

I. <u>Safe Routes to School Update</u> – Lucy Friedman-Bell reported that there is interest from Brightwood, Gerena, Bowles, and Dryden schools for safe walking/bicycling education programs in 2022-23. Principals at DeBerry and Homer schools will be meeting about the recent arrival and dismissal assessment. The quantity of students being driven does not seem to be being given enough consideration.

### II. Trails Update

<u>Highland Railtrail</u>. The East Forest Park Neighborhood Council held a meeting on April 13 about the proposed shared-use path for the eastern section of the Highland Rail. A <u>Video</u> of the proposed route taken by a drone was shown. Opposition of the trail came from a woman who lives near the proposed McKnight Trail, otherwise there was general support for the trail. A meeting of the Friends of the Highland Rail Trail is being planned for June.

<u>Riverwalk Trail</u>. The Connecticut River Conservancy, along with ValleyBike, RAD Springfield, and WalkBike Springfield, is conducting a bicycle ride along the Riverwalk on April 23, starting at 10 am at Kenefick Park. There is also an option to help with a River bank clean-up. <u>Pre-registration</u> is required.

#### III. Massachusetts Bike Month

<u>St. James/Tapley intersection</u> – MassDOT held a hearing on April 5. Concerns were raised about the level of truck traffic and desire for examples of other round-abouts that accommodate the number and variety of trucks at this intersection. At our meeting concern was raised about the tremendous backups that occur at this intersection and onto I291 when there is a funeral procession, especially when schools are being dismissed. Issue needs to be raised with the cemetery superintendent and Traffic Commission.
